## Atlanta Non-Profits Partner to Break the Guinness World Record For Longest Soul Train Line

September 5, 2019 - ATLANTA, GA - On Saturday, October 05, 2019, Atlanta-area fans of the iconic TV show "Soul Train" are invited to join local non-profits 40 Girls and Some Shoes and Project Serenitee as they attempt for the second time to break the Guinness World Record for the Longest Soul Train Line. The event is hosted by original Soul Train Line dancer, the Fabulous Ms. Anitra Jackson and will take place from 11am-5pm at The Home Depot Backyard in Atlanta. All proceeds from this event will benefit 40 Girls and Some Shoes and Project Serenitee.

For 30 years, **Soul Train** was a vital part of the urban music eco-system. Founded in 1971 by Don Cornelius, the variety show introduced new music and up-and-coming artists to African-American households across the country until 2006. Throughout that time, the **Soul Train Line** became iconic in and of itself, and has been replicated and referenced throughout urban pop culture, most recently being revived for Beyonce's 35th birthday party. The current Guinness World Record for Longest Soul Train Dance was set in 2014 at the Goodyear Ball Park in Goodyear, Arizona and consisted of 426 dancers. This year, **40 Girls and Some Shoes** founder **Sylvia Webb** and **Project Serenitee** founder **Terrence Carter** hope to bring together at least 500 dancers to not only break the Guinness World Record while raising money for their missions with Atlanta homeless communities, but also to bring unity among Atlanta residents.
